HOW I GOT INTO HAM RADIO

It all started in Junior High School in Little Rock, Arkansas. I signed up for "Industrial Arts" 9th grade class. Part of the course subjects were wood working, electrical, sheet metal and foundry. In wood working, you had to build a sanding block to specifications which was about 6" L x 4" W x3/4" D with a beveled top edge to receive a grade. Next project was to build a basic electric motor on a wooden block which included sheet metal and electrical wiring. Next project was open to your

choice but had to use three of the above materials, I decided to build a crystal set radio. I turned my tuning coil on the lathe, wound the wire on the coil, and cut the tuning slider from copper sheet metal. I purchased a "cat whisker" detector and a pair of Trimm 2,000 ohms headsets from a radio parts store a few blocks from the school. I entered my project in the school "Science Fair" but did not win any prize.

When I was promoted to high school, I found out that they had a amateur radio club "W5RFS" which drew my attention, so I joined them. The radio room was on the 4th floor and consisted of a surplus AN/ARC-5 Command Radio Set on 40 meters with a long wire antenna stretched on the roof of the school. CW was the only mode used, so I studied CW and got my Novice License "KN5GRK".

After chatting with our members, I found out there was a ham radio operator only a few blocks from my QTH. His name was Weldon Bryant W5FCM. I went down to met him which eventually ended up as Weldon being my "ELMER".

Field Day is ham radio's open house. Every June, more than 40,000 hams throughout North America set up temporary transmitting stations in public places to demonstrate ham radio's science, skill and service to our communities and our nation. It combines public service, emergency preparedness, community outreach, and technical skills all in a single event. Field Day has been an annual event since 1933, and remains the most popular event in ham radio.

No VE Testing on April 6, 2023 due to cancellation of General Meeting. Bad stormy weather all evening. Lightning, rain, wind and possible tornados in area.





- *Setting up emergency operations centers in support of operating infrastructure in the region.
- *Coordination with regional OHSEP emergency operations centers.
- *Coordination of operating frequencies and protocols for EMCOMM for interregional and intraregional communications.
- *Identifying Amateur Radio personnel to organize and lead operations at specific need areas.
- *Providing regularly scheduled meetings at various locations of all interested parties in the region.

I personally commend Barnes and the GNOARECC for the work that they have accomplished.

Annual Armed Forces Day Crossband Test

The US Department of Defense (DoD) will host this year's Armed Forces Day (AFD) Crossband Test on May 13, 2023. This annual event is open to all licensed amateur radio operators and will not impact any public or private communications. For more than 50 years, military and amateur stations have taken part in this event.

The AFD Crossband Test is a unique opportunity to test two-way communications between military communicators and radio stations in the Amateur Radio Service (ARS), as authorized in 47 CFR 97.111. These tests provide opportunities and challenges for radio operators to demonstrate individual technical skills in a tightly controlled exercise scenario.



Military stations will transmit on selected frequencies and will announce the specific ARS frequencies monitored. All of the times are Zulu (Z), and all frequencies are Upper Side Band (USB) unless otherwise noted. The frequencies used for the test will not stray outside the confines of the exercise.

AFD is a time of honor. It will be celebrated on Saturday, May 20, 2023. The first AFD was celebrated with parades, open houses, receptions, and air shows. Today, many events and activities take place and may include multi-service military displays in areas open to the public, various educational activities that teach children about the armed forces, and large parades with local celebrations.

The longest running AFD parade in the United States is held in Chattanooga, Tennessee. Certain types of music will be played at AFD 2023 events to show respect to those in the armed forces who died for their country.
