On Saturday October 14, 2023 a annular "Ring of Fire" solar eclipse occurred over Acadiana. We are in Solar Cycle 25 which will peak in 2025.



A solar eclipse occurs when the Moon passes between Earth and the Sun, thereby totally or partly obscuring the image of the Sun for a viewer on Earth. The next total eclipse will take place on Monday, April 8, 2024. This is the last one to touch North America until March 30, 2033. The only state that sees totality then will be Alaska, and the weather prospects for March in the Arctic make this one a true challenge to get into the bag.


Replacing a ICOM 706 Faceplate

75th Anniversary Special Event 5 — 11 November 2023




