

FCC to Require Two Factor Authentication for CORES Users

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has announced an upcoming change to the Commission Registration System (CORES) that licensees use to pay any application or regulatory fees, manage or reset a password on an existing FRN, or request a new FRN. Beginning March 29, 2024, multifactor authentication will be implemented. Users will be prompted to request a six-digit secondary verification code, which will be sent to the email address(es) associated with each username. The user will then need to enter the code into CORES before they can continue.

In a <u>public notice</u>, the FCC said this change will make the system more secure. "This additional layer of security will further safeguard against unauthorized access, thereby enhancing the overall integrity of information contained within the CORES system and improving the security of user data," it read. The FCC recommends that users confirm they have access to their username account email and to add a secondary email address, if need be.

International Marconi Day 2024

This year, International Marconi Day (IMD) is on April 27. Italian inventor and electrical engineer Guglielmo Giovanni Maria Marconi was born on April 25, 1874, and is credited for inventing the radiotelegraph system, creating Marconi's law, and sending the first wireless transmission over the open sea.

IMD was created to honor Marconi and is hosted annually by the <u>Cornish Radio Amateur Club</u>, GX4CRC. The purpose of the day is for amateur radio enthusiasts around the world to contact historic Marconi sites using communication techniques similar to those that he would have used.





The 24-hour event will operate from 0000 UTC to 2359 UTC, and registration is required. Participants can register at **GX4CRC's registration web page**.

Stations in the United States, including Marconi Cape Cod Radio Club, KM1CC, in Massachusetts, are already registering for the event. KM1CC hosts several onair events each year to keep the accomplishments and story of Marconi and his wireless station site in South Wellfleet alive. In 1975, the Wellfleet station was listed as a National Historic Landmark on the National Register of Historic Places and is now part of Cape Cod National Seashore, a unit of the National Park Service. When possible, KM1CC sets up a temporary radio station inside the park. More information about KM1CC is available on their Facebook page.









Heil founded Heil Sound in 1966, through which he created the template for modern concert sound systems for musicians like the Grateful Dead, The Who, Joe Walsh, and Peter Frampton. The talk box used on iconic live record *Frampton Comes Alive!* was of Heil's design. His audio engineering products have been featured in the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame, and he was honored in 2007 with the Parnelli Audio Innovator Award for his impact on the live sound industry. "My life has been about achieving great sound, whether on the concert stage or in the amateur radio world," Bob Heil recounted in 2022. "I've watched Heil Sound go from a regional sound company to a world-class microphone manufacturer. This company has been my passion," he said.

Parallel to his commercial and artistic success in live music, was his passion for amateur radio. He was active in ham radio from a young age and merged his expertise in audio engineering with his love for radio. Heil Ham Radio was founded to produce microphones, headsets, and other gear for radio amateurs with an emphasis on high-quality audio. Heil was known as a mentor who enjoyed helping others find success in ham radio. Recently, his grandson Charlie Hartley, KF0OOP, became a licensed ham to surprise Heil for his birthday. The pair attended the ARRL Midwest Convention/Winterfest in St. Louis, Missouri, on January 27, 2024.

Heil was a generous donor to amateur radio organizations, including ARRL. Recently, <u>he donated a host of new audio gear</u> to the Hiram Percy Maxim Memorial Station, W1AW.


The man who defined the sound of live rock 'n' roll music and brought audio engineering principals into mainstream amateur radio use, Dr. Bob Heil, K9EID, has passed away at the age of 83. He was an ARRL Life Member and in the ARRL Maxim Society. A Facebook post from Heil Ham Radio paid tribute to their founder: "Bob fought a valiant, yearlong battle with cancer, and passed peacefully surrounded by his family.

His generosity and kind nature will be missed by many, including ARRL Director of Development Kevin Beal, K8EAL. "Bob was a titan in many areas. He was generous with his time, offered keen insights, and had the heart of a philanthropist in the ARRL Maxim Society," Beal said. "He was a gentleman to his core, making friends easily and everywhere he went, from rock stars to captains of industry. I consider it a real privilege to have become a friend to him, too, all because of amateur radio."

Heil was known for his passion for AM operations. He served for many years as an on-camera host of the Ham Nation podcast. Tributes to Heil have been flooding social media, including from his co-hosts.

ARRL President Rick Roderick, K5UR, said Heil's passing is a significant loss. "Bob Heil's technical achievements that brought high-quality audio to amateur radio pale in comparison to his generosity and willingness to help his fellow ham. He's long been known as someone eager to help mentor and teach. His legacy on our hobby will be long-lasting. Our thoughts are with his loved ones."





Silent Key GEORGE K CARR, II WA5KBH

Deacon George Kiernan Carr, II, of Moss Bluff passed away on Sunday, February 25, 2024 from the comfort of his home.

Deacon Carr, 74, was born in New Orleans, LA to George K. Carr and Audrey Biehl Carr on April 19, 1949. He was a graduate of Archbishop Shaw High School; University of Southwestern Louisiana (ULL) with a Bachelor of Arts; Miami University with a Master of Science; and the Graduate Theological Foundation with a Doctor of Ministry.

As a young pioneer in the Cable Television Industry, he began his career as a Field Instructor for Southwest Ohio Instructional Television Association, then moved on to become an Instructor of Mass Communication at Central Missouri State University, specializing in activities and production training between institutions and Cable TV. This led to an offer of Systems Manager

for Henderson Cable TV in Kentucky, followed by various positions and management opportunities throughout Kentucky, Nebraska, Missouri, Louisiana and, ultimately, England. In 1996, Deacon Carr returned home to Louisiana and pursued his calling in ministry.

He began his studies for the diaconate in the United States and completed the process after moving to England. The Celebration of Ordination to the Diaconate occurred on September 5 1992, at Holy Family Church in Luton, England where he began his ministry in the Diocese of Northampton. Upon his return home to Louisiana in 1996, Deacon Carr served the Diocese of Lake Charles, launching the diocese's website, as well as being assigned as Deacon to Our Lady Queen of Heaven Parish. In this capacity, he provided support, empathy, wisdom, and spiritual guidance to engaged couples, married couples, young parents, and those who were grieving. He performed a multitude of baptisms as well as research and support for those seeking annulments throughout his ministry. During his 31 years in ministry, his goal was to make a difference to all he encountered. His legacy confirms he had a special place in the hearts of all he served.

Deacon Carr had a passion for Ham Radio which began as a young boy and he was a licensed Amateur Radio (HAM) Operator, WA5KBH, for 59 years. He was also a talented chip carver and enjoyed gifting his works to family and friends.

Deacon Carr was a well-respected pillar of his industry, his ministry, and within his communities. He was an active member of countless clubs, organizations, volunteer programs, and community events in every community in which he lived.

A truly humble, admirable man in every aspect of his life, it was imperative to him to maintain a balance between the needs of his family, demands of his job and his service to his ministry. He will be remembered for his listening ear, kind heart and boundless love and devotion to his faith and his family.

He leaves to cherish his memory, his loving wife of 53 years, Joan Abshire Carr of Moss Bluff; four children: Jennifer Munoz (Peggy Snyder) of Pagosa Springs, CO and grandchildren, Milagro and Mackenzie; George K Carr, III (Kristin Stiegel) of Holden, LA; Jacqueline Fontenot (Christopher) of Lubbock, TX; and Jessica Wilson (Jackson) of Lake Charles, LA; sister: Angelle Gonzalez (Robert) of Nine Mile Point, LA; brother-in-law: Craig Mundie of Seattle, WA; and sister-in-law: Linda Abshire Gremillion of Houston, TX; as well as several nieces and nephews. Also left to remember him is Hector Martinz (Samilia Fernadez) who came over from Cuba in 2015 and were embraced and mentored by George and Joan as their own.

He was preceded in death by his parents and sister, Marie Therese Mundie.

A Mass of Christian burial will be observed at 11:00 AM Friday, March 1, 2024 at Our Lady Queen of Heaven Catholic Church with Monsignor James Gaddy as the celebrant and homilist. Interment services will follow at Consolata Cemetery. Visitation at Our Lady Queen of Heaven Thursday will be from 3:30 PM until 5:00 and will resume from 7:00 PM until 9:00 with a Scripture service beginning at 7:00 PM. Visitation Friday will be from 9:00 AM until 11:00 with a Rosary service beginning at 10:00 AM.

History of World Amateur Radio Day

Amateur Radio Service was established by the I.T.U., a special agency of the United Nations formed on May 17, 1865.

Hams is another term for amateur radio operators. The term "ham" was initially used as a derogatory moniker for amateur radio operators by operators in the commercial and professional radio communities in 1909. The term was quickly adopted by the operators and became ingrained in their lexicon. The phrase, however, did not become widely used in the United States until around 1920, after which it gradually spread to other English-speaking countries.



International Amateur Radio Union (I.A.R.U.) was formed by the Amateur Radio pioneers in Paris on April 18, 1925, to support Amateur Radio worldwide. It was first discovered by Amateur Radio experimenters that the short wave spectrum could support worldwide propagation. The I.A.R.U. noted that in the race to exploit these shorter wavelengths, Amateur Radio was at great risk of being pushed aside.

Since its inception, the I.A.R.U. has worked relentlessly to safeguard and increase Amateur Radio frequency allocations. Radio amateurs can now experiment and communicate in frequency bands strategically positioned throughout the radio spectrum thanks to the help of enlightened administrations all over the world.

The I.A.R.U. has expanded from 25 countries upon its founding in 1925 to 160 member societies in three regions. Europe, Africa, the Middle East, and Northern Asia are all part of IARU Region One. Region Two includes the Americas, while Region Three includes Australia, New Zealand, the Pacific island nations, and the majority of Asia. The I.T.U. has recognized the I.A.R.U. as representing amateur radio's interests.


